XVI. PUBLIC COMMENTS ON NON-AGENDA ITEMS:

Allison Hallam, parent Elementary #1 student, spoke regarding the parent drop off and pick up at Elementary #1. Parent driving habits are a concern, which is causing a safety issue. She has witnessed parents dropping students off in the parking lot and the children walking through traffic to the school. She is also, concerned about the wheelchair access to the school. Since her son is temporarily disabled and must use a wheelchair, she has found it difficult to get her son into school on time because of the location of the handicapped parking and wheelchair cuts in the sidewalk. With the buses dropping off, it is difficult to get across the street to the entrance. It was suggested by both Mr. Paskalides and Ms. Fox that she use the ramp entrance from the administration building to drop off her son. It may be somewhat distant from his classroom but will be much less crowded.

A discussion ensued regarding the issues surrounding parent drop off/pick up at Elementary #1 and the problems that are arising due to construction. Mr. Webster is contacting the chief of police and will arrange a meeting with Dr. Salvo and Mr. Paskalides to come up with a solution to the issue.

Ms. Hodges thanked Ms. Hallam for bringing up this subject as she has become very aware of the handicapped access to all buildings. It isn't until you are in a wheelchair that you realize what the issues regarding access to buildings are.

Mr. Roberts stated that he would like to see an electronic sign in front of the Board Office to advertise the events at the schools. He asked the board if they were in consensus and all agreed that Dr. Salvo and Ms. Fox should pursue this and make it happen.
