WHEREAS, the New Jersey Department of Education Commissioner's office received a complaint alleging the District appointed a band volunteer into a position that requires a certification; and

WHEREAS, the Office of Fiscal Accountability and Compliance (OFAC) was directed to investigate this allegation; and

WHEREAS, OFAC opened Case No. INV-043-15 and reviewed pertinent Board documents and personnel records; and

WHEREAS, the Board provided all requested documentation and information; and

WHEREAS, OFAC, in a letter dated May 12, 2016 indicated that it determined and verified that the band volunteer had been employed by the Board in several part-time positions and the volunteer was properly vetted for employment; and

WHEREAS, OFAC also verified and determined that a certificate is not required for the position of band consultant, and therefore closed Case No. INV-043-15; and

WHEREAS, OFAC requires no corrective action measures to be adopted by the Board; and

WHEREAS, in the letter dated May 12, 2016 OFAC requires the Board publicly review and discuss the findings at a meeting no later than 30 days after the Board received the letter and within 30 days of said public meeting the Board adopt a Resolution certifying the findings OFAC were discussed at a public meeting; and

WHEREAS, the letter dated May 12, 2016 requires the findings of the OFAC investigation be posted on the district's website; and

WHEREAS, the Board at its May 19, 2016 meeting, did discuss OFAC's findings and reported that no corrective action plan is required; and
