- Born in Amsterdam, Netherlands, July, 1939 just before WWII began
- Now residing in New Jersey! Lived for a time in Port Washington, NY,
- Age 82
- Harvard College and Columbia University's Graduate Schools of Law and Business.

He has also served as the Chairman of the Foundation for the Jewish Historical Museum of Amsterdam. He served in the U.S. Marine Corps and Marine Corps Reserves. He practiced law for over 30 years, and has formed successful real estate ownership and management companies.

“796 Days”

Leo Ullman shares stories of how he and his family survived unimaginably harsh conditions while living in the Netherlands under Nazi occupation. Mr. Ullman's book, “*796 Days*” is about him as a Child hiding in Occupied Amsterdam During WWII. It is a first-person story of a young Jewish boy hidden by complete strangers for over two years, while his parents hid in an attic elsewhere, not knowing where their son was or if he was alive. The book chronicles Leo Ullman's life as a hidden child, as well as the stories of other family members and their miraculous survival.
