**XV. PUBLIC COMMENTS ON NON-AGENDA ITEMS:**

Ms. Sadler reported that numerous students attended the viewing/funeral of long time teacher William Simmons. She stated they showed the utmost respect at these events and she was proud to be associated with them. On behalf of the MTEA, Ms. Sadler wished Ms. Ludy the best of luck in her future endeavor and stated that she brought back honor and dignity to the title of School Business Administrator in Middle Township. She also reported negotiations are going well and MTEA looks forward to the upcoming meetings. Finally, Ms. Sadler encouraged the Board to review the MTEA proposals submitted to Administration that detailed other options in order to cease the layoff district-wide aides - she understands it is a work in progress. Mr. White commented on the recent fulfillment of the Athletic Secretary position and that his wife who held the position until she was RIF'd did not receive an interview. Ms. Sheppard asked 'How many Board members come to see what is done in the classroom?' She stated Instructional aides must have college degrees and it is mandated that she teach college prep algebra for students functioning at on a second or third grade level. If the aides are outsourced what quality of personnel will we have? Ms. Ford-White voiced concern regarding the possibility of her losing her position as a bus aide. She stated she has worked in the district since 9/2000 and it is not an easy position. Money comes and goes but it should be all about the children. Look into your hearts and re-think the privatization of the aides. Ms. Martell appealed to the Board reconsideration of the privatization of the district-wide aides as she has an adopted daughter from Russia that has special needs and the aides have worked with her and helped her flourish. Can the money being saved from the solar panel project be used to save the aides? Mr. Herron voiced concerns regarding the privatization of district-wide aides and what would happen if an aide does not show up. Without bus aides we cannot transport the children. His additional concern is next will be the privatization of the Transportation Department. Ms. McDevitt voiced that she is a

proud mom of a multiply disabled daughter and one-on-one aides have helped her go from a behavioral problem to a Sophomore honor student at the High School. She also was disappointed that the parents found out about the privatization through teachers rather than administration. Ms. Smith, a bus aide, stated she loves her job and is at poverty level already with (2) disabled students at home. A possible answer would be for all administrators to take 10% pay cut to save the aides from privatization. Ms. Bakley stated she is disappointed that the Board decided not to go to cap and request the allowable 2% increase in tax dollars from the public. She voiced that she trusts the aides that currently work in the district as they were picked by the administration not by an outside company that she doesn't know. In conclusion she stated Middle Township tax payer money should stay in Middle Township and not be given to an organization outside the county. Ms. Lashley has been in the district 9 years and understands that jobs are never secure, even ones that pay \$9.75 an hour. She requested the Board reconsider privatizing the district-wide aides and think about the effect of the privatization on the parents and students. Ms. Dykehouse stated she could not do what she does if there were not aides. She said privatization would increase the cost to the district as more students would be sent to Special Services. Ms. Gonzalez stated if not for the teachers and aides her son would have been kicked out of school. With privatization the people do not care & the Board needs to understand being an aide is not just a job, she is very scared for her son to lose his aide. Ms. Thompson stated she has a smart daughter and a special education son. Without the aide he would not be able to attend Middle Township Schools. She is proud of the school system and sad about the possible privatization of aides. Her greatest fear is that her son will be sent back to Ocean Academy. Ms. Avicolio, and aide at the Middle School, asked 'Do you have any idea what we do?' We are with these children 6 hours a day – the Board will take away our feeling of belonging if outsourced. She sees the sick and vacation time as compensation for the low pay. Mr. Miller was an employee at Special Services from 1999-2004 and knows the district gets their \$13,000 out of him. Mr. Moore, a bus aide, feels the need to privatize should only be considered if the personnel are not doing their job. He used to do a lot of student write ups and they are going down as the students are being better behaved due to the aides. He stated he does not see the Boards faces on a bus to see what they actually do. Ms. Holmes lived here for 2 years and has noticed the Special Services aides are quality aides. If they are privatized there will be constant turn over and special needs students are adverse to change. We must put the safety of our students first. Mr. Burn, a Middle Township student's dad, his daughter has gotten exemplary service for his Down's Syndrome daughter from our aides. Outsourcing will relieve financial pressure but not liability. Greater amount of weight should be given to the welfare of the students and dedicated employees than the bottom line. Mr. Hawk stated his daughter is progressing due to the aides. Mr. Roberts you were quoted stating the solar project will save jobs, you should stand behind that. Ms. Carrion has 2 autistic boys so aides are very important to her. Her sons need consistency as that is part of the disorder. Can I call the private agency if I have a problem? I doubt it. The Board is making saving money more important than her child's well-being. Ms. Novsak, Counselor at Elementary #2, states schools should not be run like corporations. It is her understanding that there will be a lack of consistency with privatization and urges the Board to reconsider. Mr. Dagney voiced that his wife received a congratulations letter signed by the Superintendent for a position that she was not interviewed for. His opinion is the Board will lose control over the aides if they are privatized. Ms. Kee petitioned the Board to reconsider what they are doing to the aides. We want to keep our jobs and we love the kids. Ms. Moore has been a bus aide for 4 years. We don't just sit on the bus.

We read to the students and sing songs with them. She even purchased an iPad to allow her one-on-one student to play with during the bus ride home to keep him occupied. Please reconsider the privatization, I love my job. Mr. Salinsky said as a parent and teacher consistency is key. You won't have that with privatization. Please reconsider. Ms. Muchler, a bus aide, stated her special education student progressed so much during his tenure in Middle Township, due to the aides – that he traveled 17,000 miles to represent Middle Township. She doesn't want to lose her job. She loves working for the District. Mr. Stahler has been a one-on-one aide for 2 years at Middle Township, he has 8 children in the school district. I just don't know, I just don't know - that's what the aides keep hearing. Camden pays \$75-\$125 per day for aides. With the money the aides make he has never heard any of them complaining about the pay. This environment has created a morale issue like never before. No one in our positions are here for the money. Nothing is guaranteed down the road with the privatization company. Ms. Standish, aide at Elementary #2 for 10 years, started when her kids were here. It is not just a job for us. It's not just a paycheck. You don't know what we do, others don't want to come in and do what we do. Come and sit in our class for one day and see what we do. Ms. Civera thanked all the aides for what they do. I have to lift up the aides, they do all this work with no benefits and very little money and yet they still do a great job. I am proud of the ones who stayed in the district after their health benefits were taken away. Our aides have relationships with the parents and the students. Please negotiate whatever it takes to keep the aides in-house.

## **XVI. BOARD COMMENT**

Mr. Roberts requested that all public keep their comments to a 5 minute limit in order to allow the entire public to speak. Mr. Melchiorre state he has been on the board for 12 years, a resident for 35 years, lived in Cape May County all his life and has been in the classroom to see what the aides do. He loves the district and its students as everyone does. He does know what the aides do and he is in the buildings regularly. Ms. Houck cautioned the public to please allow the Board to speak without interruption as they showed that respect to the public when it was their turn. Mr. Bakley said he appreciated the support everyone is showing for the aides and expressed regret to Mr. and Mrs. White for any lack of understating concerning the Athletic Secretary position. Ms. Thomas thanked everyone for coming out to support the aides. We are open (the Board) to suggestions and as Ms. Sadler has stated it is a work in progress. Do not think the Board has closed their minds to other options. Mr. Roberts stated Mr. Stahler's comments were well heard. Don't jump to conclusions that the Board wants to privatize everything as that is not true. Mr. Kopakowski voiced a number of years ago education was devastated by the governor, all proposals that are made are scrutinized by the Board. After eliminating 51 positions a few years ago (31 teaching) – we are seeing in this year's budget a direct result of the legislative mandate limiting districts to a 2% cap. 2% increase in taxes is roughly \$450,000, tuition from sending districts alone is at a \$500,000 decrease. At no time will the Board of Education members give up control of who works with our children. Remember our per pupil costs are significantly lower than the surrounding districts. We promise to take your concerns into consideration. Thank you.
